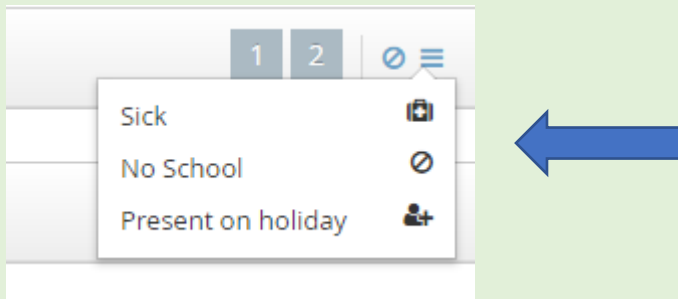




Recording School Age Children Served A.M Snack and Lunch.

Another school year is about to begin. KidKare assumes school age children are in school for a.m. snack and lunch. **If you serve a.m. snack or lunch to a school age child, you must record the reason in KidKare. If a reason is not recorded, you will not receive reimbursement.**

On the KidKare enter menu screen you will see three blue lines on the right-hand side of the gray bar with the child's name. Click on the 3 lines. Then, click, on the reason the child is receiving a.m. snack or lunch (Sick or No School).



Now your snack or lunch will not be deducted due to a school age child being served a.m. snack or lunch.

Providers claiming on paper MinuteMenu forms will find a space in the bottom section of the Claim Information Form to record the school age children present for a.m. snack or lunch.

Sliced Apple Boats

- 1 medium apple (at least 1 cup fruit)
- 2 Tbsps. peanut butter or other nut butters
- ½ cup granola (within sugar limit)
- ¼ cup dried coconut (if desired)

Cut the apple into 6 slices and carve a dip in the center of each apple slice. Fill each dip with granola. Heat the peanut butter in a microwave safe bowl for 30 second intervals, stirring between intervals, until desired consistency. Drizzle peanut butter over apple slices. Sprinkle with coconut. Serve and enjoy!

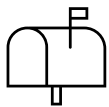
Yield: 2 servings (3 slices per serving)
